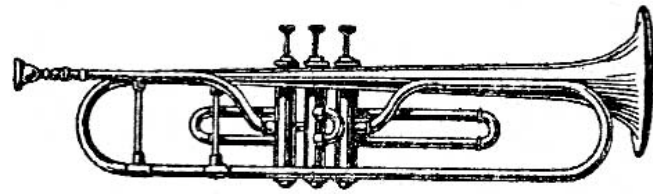

Morial Convention Center explains the history of New Orleans jazz through combination of lecture and performance by Marsalis and his band. It has the children stomping their feet, clapping along, and singing as they learn about second-lining, improvisation, riffs and how a rhythm section works.

Highlights include performances of Audubon Zoo (They All Asked for You), My Bucket's Got A Hole In It, and the St. Louis Blues.

## KET EncycloMedia Student Accounts

Discovery Education has initiated some changes that affect all present and future student accounts. We apologize for any inconvenience that this action may have caused you or your students.

The changes are intended to make Discovery's student accounts conform to the federal Children's Online Privacy Protection Act and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. Students still can have 24/7 access to KET EncycloMedia from any location, but they can no longer create their own accounts. Instead, student accounts must be created through the district/school importing tool or through the My Classrooms feature. Students also must answer indicate whether they are over or under 13 before they enter the site.
